The Traill County Commissioners came to order on April 20, 2021 at 8:00 a.m. with all members present. Commissioner Amb requested to add the mask mandate to the agenda. On motion of Nesvig, seconded by Eblen and carried to approve updated agenda. On motion of Young, seconded by Nesvig and carried to approve the minutes of April 6, 2021 as presented.

PURCHASE AGREEMENTS: On motion of Nesvig, seconded by Amb and carried to allow the Chairman and Auditor to sign Purchase Agreements with the following businesses: Sorum Oil, KRB Gravel, True North Steele, Fergusons Waterworks, Buxton Farmers Union, Lakeside Construction, CHS Ag Services and Paulson Gravel.

ALCOHOL LICENSES: On motion of Young, seconded by Amb and carried to approve and allow the Chairman and Auditor to sign the beer and liquor (on-sale only) alcohol licenses for The Brass Rail, LLC, pending approval from the State Attorney General's Office. The licenses will be held at the 1908 House rural Buxton, owner Troy Skjerseth dba Amberjack Properties. Licenses are valid from May 1, 2021 to October 31, 2021.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT: Corwyn Martin, Road Superintendent and Matt Lange, KLJ met with the board on various issues. Martin informed the Board he signed agreements with Dakota Natural Gas to install 3 meters on the highway property. Bridge 88 (low water crossing), which has been closed for years is in the process of being removed. Started chip sealing. Received quotes for the roof replacements on the Clifford and the Salt Shop from Drain Maker Construction \$25,947.00, Manthey Construction \$29,172.00 and Simonson Construction \$30,110.00. The shingled roofs will be replaced with a tin roof. On motion of Eblen, seconded by Young and carried to hire Drain Maker Construction for the roof replacements. The Roseville Township Board requested the Traill County Highway Department to disk a section of township road, Martin will bill Roseville Township tractor rates plus operator costs. Lange informed the board, quote requests for Bridge 111 are due May 3, 2021. The Kaldorville Bridge #228 is coming along. Lange presented a Phase II Task Order for the Climax Bridge replacement. On motion of Amb, seconded by Nesvig and carried to allow the Chairman to sign the task order contingent on Polk County also signing the agreement. Martin has received calls on the County Road 16 work and informed the individuals Traill County is trying to make the road safer. The new dozer is in.

REYNOLDS STREET DANCE: Jordan Adams met with the board via Webex. Adams requested approval to close County Road 25 (main street Reynolds) for a street dance on July 24, 2021 and provide a detour route. On motion of Nesvig, seconded by Amb and carried to approve the closure between 3:00 pm on July 24th and 2:30 a.m. on July 25th.

MASK MANDATE: Commissioner Amb motioned to remove the Traill County mask mandate; motion died for lack of a second.

NATURAL GAS CONVERSION: Bobbi Hepper-Olson, Hepper-Olson Architects LTD and Steve Hoepfner, OBERNEL Engineering presented probable costs involved with changing or replacing the current boilers at the courthouse from fuel oil to natural gas. Four options were offered ranging from replacing burners costing \$187,000.00 to replacing the existing boilers to hot water costing \$681,000.00. Ventilation issues were also discussed as the 115-year-old building is within compliance with the ND building codes, however the building lacks proper ventilation. No decisions were made, and the issue will be reviewed during the 2022 budget process.

CLERK OF COURT: Jody Schill, Clerk of District Court requested a commissioner to sit on the interview committee to hire a Deputy Clerk of Court. Commissioner Young volunteered.

BINGHAM TWP LAND: Devin Abentroth met with the board concerning a Wetland issue. NRCS District Director Curt Zerface and Tax Director Kayla Knudson also were present. Abentroth stated back in 1999 Houston Engineering made an error while surveying the SW1/4NE1/4 Section 2 in Bingham Township. Houston Engineering left out a 6.02 Ac track and Abentroth would like the County to add those acres into the wetland area. Zerface, Knudson and Auditor Haugen explained that the County can not change land descriptions without a proper legal document. Zerface also explained that Abentroth would also need to obtain an updated Wetland Mitigation Agreement from the Federal Government. Abentroth was instructed to contact Houston Engineering to discuss the error, obtain a corrected deed

and Wetland Mitigation Agreement and have them recorded in the Recorder's office. At this time, the land will remain as is until proper documents are recorded.

DES RADIO REPLACEMENT: Steve Hunt, Sheriff and Ben Gates, Assistant DES Director presented an updated report of expected costs involved in updating the current radio systems to the ND State SIRN system. Estimated costs to replace radios is \$180,122.46. Estimated costs to replace the E911 Dispatch Center with installation is \$295,121.00. A 10-year maintenance agreement for the Dispatch Center will run \$96,458.00. The ND State utilization fee (for the software) will run \$650.00 per month. The replacement of the equipment will be reviewed during the 2022 budget process.
