The Traill County Commissioners came to order on Tuesday, December 7, 2021 at 8:00 a.m. with all members present. On motion of Young, seconded by Amb and carried to approve the agenda as printed with no corrections. On motion of Eblen, seconded by Nesvig and carried to approve the minutes of 11-16-21.

AVHSZ: Received November Board minutes and October financials. No action needed.

SALE OF FORECLOSED PROPERTIES: On motion of Young, seconded by Eblen and carried to allow the Chairman and Auditor to sign tax deeds for the following parcels that were sold at the 11-16-21 tax auction: (1) Parcel #29-0002-08963-000 sold for \$5,669.89 to Tyler Hoyt & Lindsey Fenske (2) Parcel #29-0002-08971-000 sold for \$5,000.00 to Kevin, Maureen & Jack Boyer (3) Parcel #29-0002-08493-000 sold for \$3,050.00 to Franklin Howse.

COUNTY DEED: On motion of Eblen, seconded by Nesvig and carried to sign a County Deed with Stewart C. Carson for parcel #32-0003-05070-000 as Mr. Carson was the original owner.

F-M AMBULANCE CONTRACT: On motion of Nesvig, seconded by Young and carried to allow the Chairman to sign the 2022 agreement with the F-M Ambulance Service, dba Hillsboro Ambulance Service.

TRANSFERS: On motion of Amb, seconded by Eblen and carried to allow the Auditor to transfer \$253,000.00 from the Highway Distribution Fund to the Road & Bridge Fund. On motion of Amb, seconded by Nesvig and carried to allow the Auditor to transfer \$35,000.00 from the E911 Wireless Fund to the E911 Regular Fund.

LAND PURCHASE REQUEST: Chris Adams, from Belmont Township inquired about purchasing a 7.51 Ac tract of land the County owns. Traill County acquired the property from a FEMA Flood Buyout. The Auditor was instructed to consult with the States Attorney on this request and bring back to the next meeting.

2022 ELECTION VOTING PRECINCTS & POLLING PLACE: Auditor Haugen requested to set the 2022 election precincts and voting place, leaving them the same as the 2020 elections. On motion of Eblen, seconded by Amb and carried to approve the 2022 Election Precincts and approve the Mayville Armory as the one voting place open on election day. A complete list of Election Precincts is available upon request from the Auditor's Office.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT: Corwyn Martin, Road Superintendent and Jason Siegert, TCWRD met in person. Matt Lange, KLJ Engineer met via Webex. Martin and Siegert presented to the board a list of eight (8) bridges located along county roads that need to be replaced. Bridge #s discussed were #55, #59, #69, #87, #290, #292, #328 AND #332. A meeting will be called in early 2022 with Commission Chairman, Road Portfolio, Water Resource Reps, TC Road Superintendent and KLJ to discuss the bridges and bring back more information to a future meeting. Eblen questioned the billing process for the Elm River Watershed. Siegert will review the process and bring back to the next meeting. Lange reviewed bids received for Bridge #92. The lowest bidder was Jensen Brothers Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$687,089.25. All bids will be reviewed by Martin and Lange and will bring back more information at the next meeting.

Martin informed the board in will be ordering a new pickup, which is in his equipment budget for 2022.

COVID-19 & MASKS: Christopher Larson, Resident Council President at Luther Memorial Home, via Webex and Brenda Stallman, TC District Health Director met with the board. Larson is concerned with the new variant Omicron, and the vaccine overage rates are not where we need to be. Science has proven that wearing masks work. The issue should not be political. The ND Legislative Assembly passed a law stating State Entities can not implement a mask mandate, however the county, cities and schools have the power to implement one. Larson asked the Board to strongly consider implementing a Traill County mask mandate for 1 month, which would get everyone thru Christmas and hopefully bring our COVID cases down into the single digits. A letter from John M. Pederson, Mayville was reviewed. Mr. Pederson also asked the Board for a mask mandate which would provide the best protection for the public. Stallman, also confirmed that wearing a masks makes a big difference. The entire state of North Dakota is considered to be in a "high transmission" rate with Traill County only at 54.2% vaccinated. Traill County has had 21 people die from COVID. Stallman also informed the Board, that the County has the right to implement a mask

mandate. Commissioner Nesvig motioned to implement a Traill County mask mandate for all individuals, while indoors at public events, effective December 7, 2021 thru January 4, 2022. This motion died for lack of a "second".

TC ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT: Jim Murphy, EDC Director informed the Commission of board member openings on his board. On motion of Amb, seconded by Eblen and carried to appoint the following individuals to the Traill County Economic Development Board: (1) Dustin Olson, Portland replacing Scott Hovde (2) Craig Moen, Hillsboro replacing Sarah Lovas and (3) Marshall Erickson, Clifford will be filling a new position at-large.

TAX DIRECTOR: Kayla Knudson, Tax Director presented a License Agreement with Vanguard Appraisals, Inc. The agreement is for a 5-year term at a total cost of \$85,277.50. On motion of Eblen, seconded by Young and carried to allow the Chairman to sign the License Agreement.
