The Traill County Commissioners came to order on January 18, 2022 at 8:00 a.m. with the following Commissioners in-person: Tom Eblen, Ken Nesvig and Larry Young. Commissioners attending via-Webex: Kurt Elliott and Les Amb. Additions to the agenda: 2021 Budget Amendments, Transfer Requests, remove Kayla Knudson, add Glenda Haugen. On motion of Eblen, seconded by Young and carried to approve the amended agenda. On motion of Young, seconded by Eblen and carried to approve the minutes of 01-04-22.

GRANTS: Notice received of grants available for county and city park boards from ND State. Commissioners asked Haugen to inquired about a grant to replace the bathrooms at the county park.

BUDGET AMENDMENTS: On motion of Eblen, seconded by Young and carried to approve the following budget amendments and the expenditures over budget for 2021: <u>Budget Amendments</u>: None. <u>Budget expenditures over</u> <u>budget:</u> NDPERS-Direct Deposit Only \$9,790.58, Traffic Safety Grant \$7,835.62, Human Services/Designated Donations \$8,005.47, COVID Cares Act 2020 \$125,714.37, Hatton City Police \$8,095.41, Hillsboro City Police \$3,185.00, Sheriff/State COVID Grant \$9,900.00, Capital Projects \$43,134.00, Capital Projects Road/Bridge repairs \$28,686.25, Capital Projects General \$168,201.00, Emergency \$2,038.11, Ambulance \$18,064.90, Economic Development \$7,347.97, Historical Society \$8,112.05, Water Resource \$1,012.48, Senior Citizens \$55,630.90, Garrison Diversion \$2,543.43 and Red River Joint \$5,095.22.

TRANSFER REQUESTS: On motion of Young, seconded by Amb and carried to allow the Auditor to transfer \$197,702.09 from Farm to Market Account to Capital Projects-Road & Bridge Repairs Fund and \$150,000.00 from Highway Distribution Account to Capital Projects-Road & Bridge Repairs Fund. On motion of Eblen, seconded by Amb and carried to allow the Auditor to transfer \$15,500.00 from the General Fund to Capital Projects-Patrol Vehicle.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT: Corwyn Martin, Road Superintendent and Matt Lange, KLJ Engineer updated the board on various issues. On motion of Eblen, seconded by Young and carried to allow the Chairman to sign the Acceptance Letter on the Kaldorville Bridge (Bridge 228), as the work has been completed and inspected. On motion of Eblen, seconded by Young and carried to allow the Chairman to sign the Standard Form of Agreement for Bridge 92 with Jensen Brothers Construction. Lang informed the Board that bridge grants have been submitted with hydraulics being completed on the Climax Bridge.

AUDITOR: Glenda Haugen, Auditor presented an agreement for purchasing technology. On motion of Eblen, seconded by Young and carried to allow the Auditor to sign the agreement with Sourcewell (formerly known as National Joint Powers Alliance). Haugen requested the Commissioners to reconsider doing a salary survey with an outside consultant to help with equalizing the salaries. The salary survey was tabled until the next meeting.

SHERIFF DEPARTMENT: Joel Walsvik of Sebeka MN met with the board and had concerns over the documents he received from his open records request. Commissioner Nesvig informed Mr. Walsvik that Traill County fulfilled it's open records request, and no further discussion is needed from the Commission.

TREASURER: Carla Swanson, Treasurer presented her Pledge of Assets report as of 12-31-21. Commissioner Young introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption which motion was seconded by Commissioner Eblen:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners that banks in the county be designated depositories of public funds in the custody of the County Treasurer and in an amount not to exceed FDIC Certificates as follows, to wit: Goose River Bank-Hillsboro, Mayville & Hatton; Aspire Bank-Hatton; First State Bank-Buxton, Mayville & Portland; Dakota Heritage Bank-Hunter, Galesburg & Hillsboro (for such amounts as the county may find necessary).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that pledges as assets in the county: (1) Goose River Bank-Hillsboro, Mayville & Hatton \$1,299,553.97 (2) Aspire Bank, Hatton \$1,047,463.73 (3) First State Bank-Buxton, Mayville & Portland \$10,772,727.27 (4) Dakota Heritage Bank-Hunter, Galesburg & Hillsboro \$4,247,976.25 are hereby approved for additional deposits by the County Treasurer in excess of FDIC Certificates \$250,000 as of December 31, 2021.

The following members were present or on-line and voted aye for the adoption of the foregoing resolution: Eblen, Elliott, Nesvig, Young and Amb. The resolution was declared adopted.

ARPA COMMITTEE: Glenda Haugen requested committee member stipends and mileage when attending ARPA meetings, which is a covered expense under the US Treasury rulings. On motion of Young, seconded by Eblen and carried to approve the following expenses for the ARPA Committee meetings: To pay \$125.00 per meeting to Ben Gates, Charlie Stock, Jim Murphy and Heather Hovey and \$75.00 per meeting to Kurt Elliott, Larry Young (Sub), Matt Lange and Glenda Haugen. Mileage will also be paid (per ND State rates) to any committee member traveling from outside of Hillsboro to attend the meetings. Ben Gates and Charlie Stock updated the Commission on the newest ARPA Interim Final Ruling that came out on January 10, 2022. Counties can use up to \$10 Million of the ARPA Recovery Funds as "loss revenue" for the County General Fund, without needing to use the US Treasury revenue loss calculations, however some restrictions still apply. The ARPA Committee is requesting the Commissioners to continue with the Funding Opportunity and Application Guidance forms to see what needs are out there. Any decisions on how to use the funds must be filed with the US Treasury Dept by December 31, 2024. The projects chosen under ARPA must be completed by December 31, 2026. At this time, Commissioners will continue with the Funding Opportunity and application forms and make a final decision on the use of the funds at a future meeting.
