The Traill County Commissioners came to order on March 17, 2020 at 8:00 a.m. with all members present. On motion of Elliott, seconded by Amb and carried to approve the minutes of 03-03-20 as presented. Also present: Mike Beltz & Randy Lemm.

LOAD LIMITS: On motion of Young, seconded by Nesvig and carried to allow the county auditor to send a letter of request to the ND Highway Patrol to help with enforcing load limits.

HOUSING AUTHORITY: An individual is needed to sit on the Housing Authority Board, Young, Amb and Nesvig will check with people within their districts and bring back to the next meeting.

TRANSFER: On motion of Amb, seconded by Young and carried to allow the county auditor to transfer \$50,000.00 from the E911 Wireless Fund to the E911 Regular Fund.

NOTICES RECEIVED: Kim Jacobson has been officially hired as the Agassiz Valley Human Service Zone Director. Received updates on the Prairie Dog Infrastructure Funds.

ELECTION: On motion of Young, seconded by Amb and carried to allow the county auditor to hold a petty cash reserve, in the amount of \$200.00 for the 2020 elections. Setting of the 2020 Primary polling sites will be discussed at the next meeting.

WATER RESOURCE: Jason Siegert, Andy Neset and Lindsay Koffler met with the board. Discussion on implementing the sagging and clearing assessment for the new tax year. Will discuss at next meeting. Discussion was held on the improvement projects for drain #72 & #79. Charlie Stock, States Attorney was asked to check into the law on the County share of the projects and report back to the commission.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT: Corwyn Martin, Road Superintendent and Chris Bakkegard, KLJ met with the Board on several issues. On motion of Amb, seconded by Young and carried to allow the Chairman to sign the fuel agreements with Buxton Farmers Union, Sorum Oil Hillsboro, Nepstad's Oil Grandin. On motion of Amb, seconded by Nesvig and carried to approve a ditch cleaning permit filed by Neil Breidenbach along county road 21, section 25 in Buxton Township. On motion of Young, seconded by Amb and carried to accept the bid of Hancock Concrete for Bridge #416 box culvert replacements, in the amount of \$101,445.44. On motion of Amb, seconded by Elliott to allow Martin to advertise for gravel, road oil and culverts to be opened on April 7th at 8:15 a.m. On motion of Amb, seconded by Elliott and carried to allow Martin to purchase a gravel trailer and lawn mower, as the funds are in his budget. Chris Bakkegard, KLJ presented an agreement for services to submit the Nielsville Bridge BUILD grant. On motion of Nesvig, seconded by Amb and carried to allow the chairman and auditor to sign the agreement. On motion of Amb, seconded by Larry and carried to allow the chairman and auditor to sign the Scope of Services with KLJ, Engineers for Bridge 366 structure replacement, in the amount of \$34,000.00.

RIVERWALK ADDITION COMMITTEE: Committee consists of Charlie Stock, States Attorney; Corwyn Martin, Road Superintendent, Thomas Eblen, Traill County Commission Chairman, and Matt Lange, KLJ Engineers. Stock, Martin, Lange and also Steve Hunt, Sheriff met with the following Hillsboro City leaders: Mayor Terry Sando, Council Member Mike Kress and City Auditor Matt Mutzenberger. Concerns were discussed about the new addition such as permits the city will need to obtain from the County, weight limits, drainage, bicycle & foot traffic while crossing the interstate. The city will take items into consideration and the group will meet again at a future date.

CORONAVIRUS UPDATES: The Traill/Steele County Incident Command Staff consists of: Brenda Stallman, TC District Heath Director; Courtney Tangen, Public Health Director; Kim Jacobson, Agassiz Valley Human Service Zone Director; Steve Hunt, Traill County Sheriff; Wayne Beckman, Steele County Sheriff; Ben Gates, Traill/Steele DES Coordinator and Charlie Stock, Traill/Steele States Attorney. Stallman explained that the COVID-19 virus situations is changing daily if not hourly. Testing and personal protective supplies are in short supply. Schools across the nation have closed until further notice. All events with 10 or more attendees should be cancelled. The Incident Command Staff met at the Portland Fire Hall on Thursday, March 12, 2020 at 6:00 pm along with Doug Murphy, Public Health

Regional Representative (via phone); Steele County Officials: Commissioner Russell Walcker and Auditor Emily Wigen and Traill County Officials attending were Commissioner Tom Eblen, Auditor Glenda Haugen and Beth Morrow, Agassiz Valley Social Services. Making a plan and getting the word out to the public was top priority and making sure the public is receiving accurate information on the virus.

SIRN 2020 PROJECT: Steve Hunt, Sheriff and Ben Gates, Traill/Steele DES Coordinator discussed the state Sirn 2020 project. This project was implemented by the State of North Dakota in HB 1435 to help all emergency agencies across the state to communicate with each other. Various equipment will need to be purchased with plans to implement the project sometime in 2024, until that time, our current system will run as usual. The State has awarded bid to Motorola Company. Costs to the County could run upwards of \$540,000.00 to change over all vehicles and systems inside the Dispatcher center. \$1,500.00 rebate per sheriff's vehicle will be available from the State. The cost of the dispatch center alone will be shared with Steele County as Traill answers their calls. The County will look into financing options for the SIRN 2020 project.

NEXT GENERATION 911: Our current 911 dispatch call center is need of updates. Motorola has the newest Vista 911 Next Generation Equipment with capabilities for individuals to "text" a 911 call. Under the ND State Plan, to lease the equipment with Motorola Company, which would include hardware, software, and maintenance agreement, the cost would be \$20,000.00 buy in and \$3,000.00 per month.

EMERGENCY DECLARATION: On motion of Amb, seconded by Elliott and carried to approve the Pandemic Illness Plan as presented. On motion of Young, seconded by Nesvig and carried to approve the Isolation & Quarantine Plan as presented. On motion of Elliott, seconded by Young and carried to immediately restrict county business travel and ask employees for personal self-isolation procedures if they have traveled outside the state. On motion of Amb, seconded by Nesvig and carried to adopt and follow the Federal and State procedures and guidelines currently in place on travel and exposure with the virus.

SHERIFF: Steve Hunt, Sheriff presented an amendment to the ND DOT Contract #12191213 concerning speed enforcement and additional funds available to Traill County. On motion of Young, seconded by Amb and carried to allow the Chairman to sign the agreement.
